Genus: Asplenium
Family: Aspleniaceae
Order: Polypodiales
Class: Polypodiopsida
Phylum: Pteridophyta

Key Facts:

Toxicity: Considered non-toxic to humans and pets.
Invasiveness: Not invasive.
Plant Type: Epiphytic fern.
Lifespan: Perennial.

Characteristics:

Plant Height: Can reach up to 2 feet tall.
Spread: Can spread up to 2-3 feet.
Leaf Type: Long, arching fronds arranged in a rosette pattern, resembling a bird's nest.
Bloom Time: Rarely blooms indoors.
Growth Rate: Slow to moderate.

Distribution:

Origin: Native to Australia and New Zealand.

Habitat: Found in the wild growing on trees or rocks in moist, shaded areas of rainforests or subtropical forests.

Care:

Difficulty: Generally easy to care for.

Toughness: Resilient once established.

Maintenance: Low.

Watering: Requires regular watering to keep the soil consistently moist but not waterlogged. Mist the leaves frequently to maintain humidity.

Pruning: Remove dead or damaged fronds as needed to maintain appearance.

Propagation: Can be propagated by division of the rhizome or by spores.

Repotting: Repot every 2-3 years or when the plant outgrows its container.

Conditions:

Temperature: Prefers temperatures between 15°C to 24°C. Avoid sudden temperature changes and drafts.

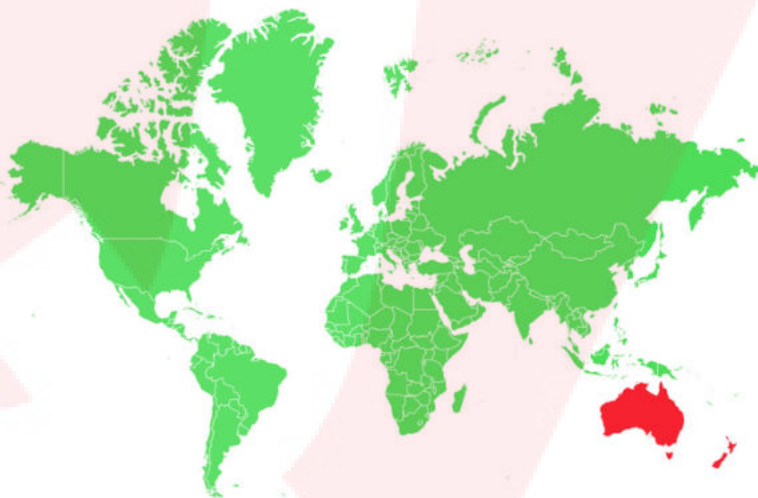
Hardiness Zone: Typically grown indoors, but can be grown outdoors in USDA hardiness zones 10-11.

Sun Requirements: Prefers bright, indirect light. Protect from direct sunlight, which can scorch the fronds.

Soil Type: Well-draining, aerated potting mix with good moisture retention.

Use: Ornamental indoor plant, fern gardens, shaded borders, and container planting.

Location: Suitable for indoor spaces, shaded patios, and tropical gardens
